STATE EDUCATION WEEK and **WORLD TEACHERS' DAY - A TIME TO SAY THANKS**

Celebrated in more than 100 countries worldwide, World Teachers' Day was established by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) in 1994 to recognise the role of teachers in society. **Every day teachers are building students' skills that translate into future careers. They are shaping our future citizens and creating the next generation of leaders and innovators.** This important work is honoured on World Teachers Day.



State Education Week is held from Sunday 23 October until Saturday 29 October. This annual week-long celebration is an opportunity to recognise the talent and achievements of students and teachers in state schools and showcase their wonderful work to the wider community.

At Bounty Boulevard State School we are proud of the professionalism and dedication of our teachers in making a difference every day for our children.

Students, parents and community members are invited to help celebrate by joining in classroom celebrations and the school's activities on Friday 28th October.

REMEMBRANCE DAY

Why is this day special to Australians?

At 11 am on 11 November 1918 the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years continuous warfare. The allied armies had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. In November the Germans called for an armistice (suspension of fighting) in order to secure a peace settlement. They accepted the allied terms of unconditional surrender.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died in the war. This first modern world conflict had brought about the mobilisation of over 70 million people and left between 9 and 13 million dead, perhaps as many as one-third of them with no known grave. The allied nations chose this day and time for the commemoration of their war dead.

On the first anniversary of the armistice in 1919 two minutes' silence was instituted as part of the main commemorative ceremony at the new Cenotaph in London. The silence was proposed by Australian journalist Edward Honey, who was working in Fleet Street. At about the same time, a South African statesman made a similar proposal to the British Cabinet, which endorsed it. King George V personally requested all the people of the British Empire to suspend normal activities for two minutes on the hour of the armistice "which stayed the worldwide carnage of the four preceding years and marked the victory of Right and Freedom". The two minutes' silence was popularly adopted and it became a central feature of commemorations on Armistice Day.

On the second anniversary of the armistice in 1920 the commemoration was given added significance when it became a funeral, with the return of the remains of an unknown soldier from the battlefields of the Western Front. Unknown soldiers were interred with full military honours in Westminster Abbey in London and at the Arc de Triumph in Paris. The entombment in London attracted over **one million people within a week to pay their respects at the Unknown Soldier's tomb. Most other allied nations adopted the tradition of entombing unknown soldiers over the following decade.**

After the end of the Second World War, the Australian and British governments changed the name to Remembrance Day. Armistice Day was no longer an appropriate title for a day which would commemorate all war dead.

In Australia on the 75th anniversary of the armistice in 1993 Remembrance Day ceremonies again became the focus of national attention. The remains of an unknown Australian soldier, exhumed from a First World War military cemetery in France, were ceremonially entombed in the Memorial's Hall of Memory. Remembrance Day ceremonies were conducted simultaneously in towns and cities all over the country, culminating at the moment of burial at 11 am and coinciding with the traditional two minutes' silence. This ceremony, which touched a chord across the Australian nation, re-established Remembrance Day as a significant day of commemoration.

Four years later, in 1997, Governor-General Sir William Deane issued a proclamation formally declaring 11 November to be Remembrance Day, urging all Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11 am on 11 November each year to remember those who died or suffered for Australia's cause in all wars and armed conflicts.

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Year 5 Camp Medication

I will be attending year 5 Camp this year to support students, some of whom are listed under Special Education Programs within their classes. I will be overseeing Medication for all students on the year 5 camp. Please deliver any medication, appropriately labelled by Chemist, to the Supernova by the Friday before camp. Please ensure that any regular daily medications are placed in a Webster pack by your chemist to ensure safe and accurate administration on camp.



I have been visiting classes to show power-point photos of activities we will be doing on camp and sharing fears and uncertainties about going somewhere different. I've been talking about my own experiences at this camp last year. Students are looking forward to the experience. All students in the class benefit from these supports in our Inclusive environment. Camp attendance greatly improves students confidence and self belief that they can overcome obstacles as diverse as home sickness and challenging activities.

SEP staff continue to support students in class and in withdrawal rooms as they work on in class activities. They continue to provide appropriate Adjustments to assessment under the collaborative guidance of class and SEP teachers.

Transitions

Transition visits to Prep for those students with disabilities who will be new to our school in 2017 are ongoing. Please email me jdavi269@eq.edu.au if your child will be coming to Bounty Boulevard State School Prep in 2017 and has additional needs such as those supported through the Early Childhood Development Programs if you are not already in contact with me. We are continuing to take students supported under Special Education Programs (SEP) on visits to the areas and likely classrooms for their new year levels in 2017. We are spending some time in rooms, checking areas used for eating and speaking positively about the upcoming changes for the new school year. We are also taking our year twos to the year three to six play area in the Supernova for several play sessions per week. This gives them an opportunity to meet more students from the upper school and become accustomed to the new areas.

Supervised Play

These programs are ongoing with attendance available to students supported under SEP. They are encouraged to invite a peer from their class into this space. It is a much sought after opportunity with many students asking to go to the Supernova. We work on encouraging SEP students to engage in the playground. Many never attend Supervised Play as they participate in the general life of the school as they will in wider world as they grow to adulthood. Our goal is to always increase the independence of our students, to strengthen their ties with peers outside the Supernova and to demystify this environment for other students.

More Support for Students With Disabilities courses

Three of the teachers in our school: Shelli Sorrel, Linda Hamilton and Amanda Lilley are currently conducting training courses in Dyslexia, Autism and Behaviour respectively. These courses involve teachers and some teacher aides working in their own time for 20 hours to further develop skills in these areas. The More Support for Students with Disabilities (MSSWD) is a Commonwealth Government initiative which aims to ensure Australian schools and teachers are better able to support students with disability. Building workforce capability to further strengthen and improve learning outcomes for students with disability is the key strategy of this initiative. The intensive learning program, developed from evidence informed practice, is empowering schools leadership teams and staff to better support students with disability.

Swimming Support

As the year 2 and 4 Swimming Program continues, SEP staff consult with Class Teachers and Swimming Instructors and with Transport Companies to support SEP students' inclusion in the school swimming program. An SEP staff member attended the first day of swimming to ensure student safety and to provide modelling of processes and expectations. Where ongoing presence was required this was arranged. Staff reviewed visuals with students of process for preparing for swimming lessons. SEP staff are available in the SEP to support students who need assistance in changing into and out of swimming costumes. Some students require check-ins or prompts and some may require more direct support. Other students in the classes often benefit from measures taken to support SEP students.
