

Dear Parents & Students

This Friday will be a month since your child has started school for 2016 and I hope your child /children have settled in well.



Classes for 2016

As our school is in a growth belt we are anticipating that a number of students will continue to grow through natural enrolment growth. Currently we have 51 classes. As an Executive team we have chosen to leave the class configuration as it currently is. There has been some evening out of classes and rebalancing of learning teams in some of the respective classes. Thank you to the few parents for your positive management of the change process. In the interest of transparency there is a possibility should we grow significantly in a particular year level we will be required to reconfigure some classes later in the year. Admin will continue to monitor and appraise parents should this need arise.

Academic Foci for 2016

As you are aware, our mandate is to maximise your child/children's potential. This year our focus is on:

Literacy: Guided reading, home reading - book a night and improving comprehension

Writing: Linking our writing and reading to make it more purposeful for children

Numeracy: Promoting place value, improving automaticity of number facts and tables and improving problem solving

Positive Behaviour Learning: PBL - this is a regional /state wide program. We are about to begin Tier 2 and in essence this program encourages students to honour our 4 respects, take ownership for their own behaviour and their learning. We are continuing to embed common language and practice across our school so we have consistency in supporting all students.

Target or Goal Setting

I have requested staff sit with you as parents over Week 5 for 15 minutes. It is essential that the child and the parent/s attend this meeting. We would like all children to have a personalised goal for: Literacy, Numeracy & Personal Goal (behaviour, attendance etc). These will be simple goals or realistic targets set in collaboration with all 3 parties. I am keen for the children to have strong ownership for these goals to help them gain traction with their learning. There is an online booking system which can be accessed through <https://www.schoolinterviews.com.au> and then parents can enter the code: mefvvt. The online booking system has been designed to make this process easier for all. Hopefully parents can manage to meet several teachers on the same afternoon. trust you find this process useful.

Annual Implementation Plan—AIP

Communication

We have been utilising a multi modal approach to reach our school community: newsletters, website, Facebook, school carpark sign, front office notice board and email. Transport & Safer Schools Travel Program

We have enrolled and are engaging with Moreton Bay Regional Council. This program is an education program for all of us student staff & parents to look at an effective dispersal model to ensure safe access in & out of school. We are promoting a variety of themes to engage the children **through class competitions etc and "Golden Boot Awards."** **Key strategies we are looking for your partnership in are encouraging** the following:

Walking to school (in pairs, groups or with older children is a great idea)

Riding bikes to school (please bring lock to secure bikes)

Carpooling

Parking in neighbouring streets and students utilising our laneways to walk short distance to school

Staff will be collecting data and the most active classes each week receiving the Golden Boot Award on assembly. (There will be a boot award for Lower, Middle and Upper School)

Our local council are doing a great deal to improve infrastructure around our school (please see Dec minutes P&C)

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL (PREP & YEAR 1)

It is amazing just how quickly students have settled into their new classes and are now working to routine. The teachers have done a wonderful job with students in establishing class rules and expectations.

Attendance— It is lovely to see students coming to school every day and arriving on time. This is so important for their learning. Most classes begin their literacy or numeracy lessons first up in the day, so it is especially important that your child is on time.

Books: It is very important that all students have the correct books. Teachers in Prep and Year 1 are telling me that not all students have their books yet, and some have books with the incorrect lines. **Would you please check with your child's teacher about whether your child has all of the correct books? It makes your child's learning very difficult if they don't have them.**

Assemblies: We now have assemblies on Mondays at 2:20pm. The Preps are learning quickly about the protocols of assembly, and we have changed to a short & sharp 20min session to help them and the Year 1 students manage their behaviour for the entire assembly time.

Before and after school: The doors open at 8:50 for Prep and Year 1, and it is important that you do not go to the classroom or bag racks before that time. This is an important time for teachers to prepare for the day. Please wait in the designated areas with your children, and do not allow your children to play on the equipment during this time as there is no supervision. After school the same applies – it is important that the teacher finish the day without interruption. Please do not allow children to play on the equipment, as again we have a duty of care to your child and there is no supervision.

Welcome: Welcome to Bounty in 2016. I have met many parents already and look forward to meeting the rest of you soon – maybe at our goal setting session next week. Thank you to those parents who are able to help out in the classrooms. I know that at this time of the year the teachers welcome all the help they can get.

Communication: **Talking to your child's teacher is paramount in these early days. Any issue, however small you may think it is, may be quickly sorted with a word to the teacher. You may also make a time to see me should you wish to.**



DEPUTY PRINCIPAL (YEAR 2 & YEAR 3)

A warm hello to you all. First of all I would like to acknowledge Lynette Trye for her hard work in revamping our school newsletter. Our school newsletter is available every second week to download. At Bounty, we are constantly striving to improve our communication within the school. I am pleased to announce that we will be introducing a school Facebook page in the near future and the school has just purchased an SMS System to be used throughout the school. We are currently merging all of our data across to the SMS system so that we can start using this effectively within our school within the next couple of weeks.



At Bounty, we strive to provide all of our children with a safe and supportive learning environment. I would like to remind all of the students along with the parents and carers that playing games before and after school along with using the play equipment is not a safe option for our students. Even though some of these students may be under the supervision of parents and carers, our school expectations of behaviour state that games and unsupervised play is prohibited. I thank parents and carers for their anticipated support in ensuring that children remain safe at our school.

I would like to remind all parents and carers about returning their B Connected 2016 participation agreements. This ensures that children can use their iPads for learning at Bounty. Parents and carers are directed to download the iTunes U Course which can be accessed by opening the iTunes U app and enrolling in the course by entering the code FPY-PSF-TTC. This has all of the relevant information around B Connected in the school. There will also be a B Connected information session to be held later in the term.

The Home School Digital Resource Scheme is a bargain this year. \$26 to have full access to Literacy Planet and Mathletics. Please ensure that the relevant paperwork has been completed and payment made by the 11th of March. This is when the access to students will be ceased if they have not paid for the resource.

Finally, it has been wonderful to see such a strong parent gathering at the assemblies this year. We hope to see more parents and friends of Bounty at these assemblies every Monday afternoon (2-3 & 4-6 @ 2:15pm, Prep—1 @ 2:30pm).

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL (YEAR 4-YEAR 6)


Thank you to all parents that were able to come to the parent afternoon sessions. It was lovely to meet you and look forward to working with you and your children.

I just want to remind everyone in year 4-6 that school starts at 8:40am and finishes at 2:45pm. We are consistently having students arriving after 8:40am. If a student is late 10 mins a day to class, that equals 50 mins a week, over a term that equals 500 minutes which equals 8 and half hours, nearly 2 school days lost. Over the year that is 10 school days lost of your child's education. After school if you child is waiting with you as you pick up your other children, it is important that they are not playing handball or making too much noise outside the younger classrooms. They are finishing off their day, please be considerate.



This year, we are focusing on the uniform. Please remind your children to wear black school shoes, I know the colourful ones look great, but we need to adhere to the uniform policy, which was agreed when enrolling at Bounty Boulevard SS. Also making sure students wear blue/navy blue socks, black/blue/white hair ties and no jewellery that isn't cultural or religiously significant.

This year the school has signed up with the Travel Choice program to help encourage families to find alternative ways to arrive and depart school. Below is the hands up data survey we did with the students. It shows we have 59% of student body arrive by car. We are going to aim to reduce this by the end of the year. On Friday week 6, March 4th we are participating National Ride2School Day.



This year our aim is to reduce car use to school by 10%. Worldwide studies are showing more and more primary school aged children are being diagnosed with Type 2 Diabetes (typically an adulthood chronic disease). Queensland is no exception to this rule. Type 2 Diabetes comes about due to poor diet and lack of physical activity. It is recommended that adults get 30 minutes and children 1 hour of physical activity a day to stay fit and healthy. It is easy to reach this target if you break up your time throughout the day.

Therefore, we are encouraging all our families to increase your physical activity by simply parking a little bit further from the school and walking the rest of the way. Did you know that it only takes 15 minutes to walk 1km at a slow pace. With almost 90% of the school population living in the catchment area this should be easy for most families to try at least once a week. Why not pick up one of our Active and Safe Mapping Booklets from the office and use the suggested parking locations and walk or wheel part of the way to school.

Welcome back to all our families. Support Teachers and Teacher Aides have been working to facilitate transitions for students with disabilities to ensure inclusion in their new classes. This support is differentiated according to needs. Staff and students are settling well with many innovative structures and strategies in place. Timetables are now shifting to accommodate focused and intensive teaching. SEP Support Teachers have been contacting parents to arrange support meetings to begin writing Personalised Learning Plans. We are looking forward to a productive and interesting year.

HOSS—HEAD OF STUDENT SERVICES

At Bounty, we have been on a journey of implementing a school-wide program for explicitly teaching behaviour to equip students to be more successful learners and friends. A team of teachers and administrators meet on a fortnightly basis to advance this program, called Positive Behaviour for Learning (or PBL, formerly SWPBS), across the school to improve the learning outcomes for the students at Bounty Boulevard. This is a program that we are building on from last year, and some families may recall the positive behaviour rewards they saw at the end of last term as a result of students collecting Bounty Gold for making great behaviour choices. We also have short-term rewards with a draw on assembly each week for a bear mascot or Café treat. Some of our Bounty Gold winners so far this term have been Jayden 1D, Christopher 3W, Olivia 1DT and Noah 2BU.



Each week, we have a particular focus based around our four school rules; Respect for Self, Respect for Others, Respect for Learning, and Respect for Property and Environment. These lessons are taught in all classrooms across the school on Monday afternoons.

In Week 4, our focus is on making safe and respectful transitions in the classroom and around the school.

In week 5, we will be talking about respecting property and environment, focussing on the eating areas and how we act during this time.

It has been great to see so many students and families using the LIC, and to help keep the LIC as a real hub of our school, please see below for some helpful information.

Your child's class will visit the school library (LIC) either weekly or fortnightly to select books. You can help your child by reading to or with him/her and asking questions about the story. Encourage your child to spend time reading at home every day.

Monday – Friday Mornings 8:20 – 8:50am

Monday – Friday Afternoons 2:45 – 3:15pm

Students will also have opportunities to visit the library independently during their lunch hour.

Borrowing and returning Books

Students may borrow up to two books at a time, so long as none is overdue.

Students are responsible to handle library books with care, since they are for everyone to share.

Please keep books away from pets, food, and all liquids. All books need to be carried in a library bag. No bag, no borrowing

Any book damage should be reported to the library as soon as possible so we can attempt repairs.

A book may be renewed (checked out again) if the student is not finished reading it. An overdue (late) book means a student cannot borrow another book (until the overdue book is renewed or returned).

Fines and Fees

If a book is lost or damaged beyond my ability to repair it, your child will be fined the cost of the book. Payment toward a replacement will be requested from the parents. These policies are not intended to keep children from borrowing and enjoying books. They help to ensure that students have access to our books by discouraging students from stockpiling or losing books at home.

Hello from your school chaplain, Christina.

I trust your holidays were a fun and safe time, full of great memories with family and friends.

This year I am looking forward to another year of getting to know our great school community and be involved in mentoring students and providing social and emotional help where it's needed and being a positive friend here in the school community.



After the phone call hoax the school received, I thought about how, as a parent, do we talk with our children about what happened. When we raise our children at different stages of their development we need to warn them about safety issues, such as crossing a road. We don't want to scare them to the point of having an irrational fear of being able to cross the road, rather we explain the safety procedures and explain what may happen if we don't follow these safety procedures. The same goes for our fire and evacuation procedures at home or school. We practice these so that in case of an emergency the students and staff can calmly evacuate without causing a panic. I believe we did such a fantastic job and we did all remain calm and safe. It is important to not heighten fears but calmly debriefing a situation can be beneficial and necessary for some children and families.

Family magazine has a fantastic outline on how to discuss bomb threats with your children, I really encourage you as caregivers to quickly read this and see if it may assist you in this discussion process.

It is imperative that you sign in and out each day as we refer to the report in the event of an emergency evacuation or lock down to ensure all staff, students and visitors are safe.

PARKING AT BOUNTY BOULEVARD STATE SCHOOL - Julie Greer, Councillor for Division 4 , Moreton Bay Regional Council

In regard to the issue of parking around the School, I would like to inform parents that Moreton Bay Regional Council has been working with the School to assist the parking situation in the following areas:

For the past three years, Bounty Boulevard State School has been participating in the 'Safer School Travel Program' that aims to encourage improved road safety. We have had officers out at the school on many occasions speaking with parents that were illegally parked and educated them on the safety issues.

The school has signed up to participate in the 2016 'Travel Choice School Program' which encourages active modes of travel such as walking, cycling and public transport. We emphasise that non-car modes of travel help to reduce congestion and safety concerns around the school.

In 2014 the school was part of a new project named 'Active and Safe Mapping' to provide road safety information and suggested options for parents to park away from the school and walk to collect their children.

Council is currently putting the finishing touches to plans for additional modifications to the traffic signals at the intersection of Bounty Boulevard and Aurora Boulevard. These improvements will include changes to the lane designations on the southern, western and eastern approaches to the signals and a reconfiguration of the existing traffic signals to completely separate the movement of pedestrians and vehicles. The works are proposed to be carried out in April 2016 and will result in improvements in safety for pedestrians and cyclists at this location.

Council had received numerous complaints over a long period of time from residents of Daintree Circuit and other streets regarding vehicles parking across their driveways, on footpaths and illegally parked during school drop off and pick up times. Council is obliged to investigate and act on all complaints. Council officers will be patrolling all schools in the region from time to time. Unfortunately, we have no control over the Police presence.

Council's Traffic & Transport Section are investigating the need and requirement for further signage in Daintree Circuit.

Please be assured that the Council and I continue to work with the school and parents to try and improve road safety issues around the school.

Flashing School Zone Signs at Bounty

During the past four years, the Department of Transport and Main Roads has been reviewing all school zones within Queensland. The review has highlighted that road safety in the Aurora Boulevard school zone at Bounty Boulevard State School could be improved by the installation of flashing school zone signs.

This message is to let you know that it is now planned to replace the existing school zone signs in Aurora Boulevard with flashing School Zone signs. The work is programmed to be carried out at the week starting 15th February 2016.

The installation of flashing school zone signs improves visibility of school zones and serves as an active reminder or motorists to slow down.

For your information, flashing school zone signs consist of a standard school zone sign that incorporates a flashing red circle around the speed limit as well as two flashing yellow lights. **These signs are intended to draw motorists' attention to the operation of the school zone.** The lights only flash during school zone times and only on school days.
