Dear Parents & Students,

## Hall Construction

I am pleased to inform you that the State Government on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March announced a grant for capital works of \$5 million for a hall at Bounty Boulevard State School. As the largest primary school in Queensland we really welcome this announcement by the Honourable Minister for Education Ms Kate Jones. There has been a number of people instrumental in lobbying for this hall in particular Mr Chris Whiting local member for Murrumba, our school P&C and school council, staff, parents and students who united to assist in making this capital project a reality.



This hall will be a welcome addition to teaching and learning here at Bounty. My understanding is the hall will have a multi-purpose court and a stage for our Performing Arts. We will be able to hold whole school assemblies which cultivate public speaking with our school leaders. In the past we have hired halls for school performances and professional development as we have 145 on staff and 1340 children P – 6. We will now be able to host these events on our campus. This venue will also provide shade and alternate class area for our HPE classes during inclement weather. Currently our school runs a variety of lunchtime clubs and we will incorporate the facility into this rotation model. Outside School Hours Care is a service provided for our children who will be able to utilise this facility to augment this service along with vacation care for our school community. The school executive team, P&C and school council will collaborate on a business plan with the school community who may wish to access this facility.

The timeline for completion of this facility is late 2017 as informed by Infrastructure and Design Central office. This capital works is a high priority project. I am looking forward to the opening of this building for our whole school community to access. There will be a display with the hall plans in the foyer in Term 2. Tenders closed this week and approval will take place for the successful builder within 10 days.

## Staffing Changes

I am pleased to announce the appointment of two permanent Deputy Principals. Congratulations to Kerri McGrath and Crystal Kirkwood they both commenced in a permanent capacity last week on the 18<sup>th</sup> April. Ms Kirkwood will manage the Y5-6 sub school & Mrs McGrath will continue to lead Y1- 2 sub school.

## Attendance

Deputies are reporting to me that attendance is approximately 92%. Parents, everyday counts and every day is a day of learning. Should your child be away please use the absence line (school administration office 3482 1333) or absence text notification to the school on 0429398844 (text message only). Please state the following: Name of child, class, duration of absence and reason. **Should your child be absent for more than three days a doctor's certificate would be greatly appreciated. Also if one child is away it appears that this has a knock on effect in just a few families resulting in other siblings who are not ill being kept at home. Should there be issues in getting your children to school, please feel free to source support from respective DPs or our Guidance Officer Mrs Annette Waterton.**

## Parking & Use of the Drop Off Zone

Parent just a kindly reminder in relation to the drop off zone:


- Please do not leave your car

### THE ARTS

Thank you Susan Liyanage for supporting our strings students last term. This term (and for the remainder of the year) we have Mr George Stylianou teaching strings. George has taught in metropolitan schools and has added our circuit of schools to his existing ones. He plays regularly on the weekends with his brother who is also a music teacher. He comes with much experience and is keen to get underway with our students. Because George already has a timetable in place for his existing schools, he was unable to come to Bounty on a Friday. Hence, beginning this week, strings lessons will be on a Thursday.

### PBL

PBL, as you will be aware is a positive behaviour for learning system. Within this system there are 3 tiers of behaviour management. We have been functioning in Tier 1 which establishes and embeds expectations for the whole school. Our regional behaviour team recently completed an audit of our processes and I'm delighted to report that we are now about to move into Tier 2. This means that we continue to embed and fine tune our existing processes, but we now also look at targeted interventions which address students' social-emotional learning through evidence based programs.

Welcome back to school for term 2. Last week our classes settled in very quickly and I was impressed with how everyone got back on with the job and into the normal classroom routines. My visits to classes showed students engaged in the learning and working hard to achieve their goals. This term I will continue to work with the year 1 and 2 teachers on our guided reading processes to improve consistency of practice across the two year levels. We have a large number of staff attending an afterschool PD in a couple of weeks and our HOC Frances Roberts and I will continue with our observations and feedback to class teachers along with modelling some lessons of what good practice is in guided reading.



#### Attendance

This term we continue to focus on improving student attendance across the school. I will now be sending out to my cohort their attendance figures each week and will be awarding classes with the highest attendance each week on parade. Every Day Counts is an Education Queensland initiative that promotes the importance of being at school on time every day. Currently our year 1 students are sitting at 93.36% and our year 2 students are at 93.95% both are slightly below what we aim for – **so let's work hard to improve our attendance data this term.**

**QParents allows parents to connect instantly with their child's school to access and manage their child's student information, including:**

- Attendance and absence details, as well as the ability to notify the school of an absence
- Academic report cards
- Viewing unpaid invoice details, payment history, and making payments online
- Viewing and updating personal student details, including medical conditions and address
- Enrolment details

**QParents won't replace the traditional ways you communicate with our school, but it will provide another way to communicate with us.**

Term 2 is well and truly underway. On assembly this week, it was my pleasure to present students with their PBL Positive Behaviour certificates for Term 1. Each class chose two students who had received the most Bounty Golds in their class over the term. **It was great to see the smile on the children's faces. They enjoyed a treat for their excellent behaviour last term with some time in the park.** At Bounty, our PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) Team work tirelessly to improve the implementation of behaviour. **They analyse behaviour data and respond to the needs identified across the school. The PBL Team's Bounty Gold initiative has been very successful and this was evident on Monday as I handed out certificates.**



Thanks to the 161 parents who responded to our most recent communication survey. It was very evident that parents and carers value this school newsletter publication. QSchools and the school Facebook page are certainly the most popular avenues of communication. The class based app Bloomz was also a popular mode of communication for parents and the community as it was specific to a particular class/child. The survey also showed us that parents and carers value the updates and class newsletters provided by their **child's class** teacher. The results of the survey were presented for discussion to the P&C last week.

Through the analysis of this survey, as a school we have decided to change how we communicate, especially our school newsletter. This will be the last PDF copy of our school newsletter. Our next newsletter will be published in collaboration with the team from Schoolzine. Schoolzine will be providing a tablet friendly, interactive newsletter option. Further to this though, will be the extra elements that will add to our newsletter. The newsletter will also be delivered to all of our parents email inboxes too for ease of use. No more pinching and zooming to read the content. All in all, this will be a very exciting step forward.

I have to confess in my 5 years as a DP at the school, communication and trying to tailor it to the needs of our community has become a bit of an obsession of mine. I feel that in such a busy and time-poor society, everyone wants to know what is going on in a streamlined manner. **'Cut the fluff and get to the stuff' one might say.**

I look forward to the feedback around our implementation of Schoolzine and its features throughout 2017. There may be a few speed bumps along the way and I know as usual, parents and carers will be supportive of this as we transition to a new format. I think this is a great example of how we as a school value the opinions and ideas of our parents and community members. We have responded with this wonderful initiative **and I can't wait to see it rolled out across the school.** There will be an app that parents can download and this information will be shared in the near future.

Finally, I wanted to take the opportunity to say a huge thankyou to all involved for their support of our school Hall. As our school has grown, we have had to adapt constantly to this growth. The Middle Years Undercover Area used to easily cater for all of our students in the school for assemblies and presentations. Now, it can barely fit the Year 3 & 4 cohort for assemblies. Our school hall will be a terrific additional learning space for our children. From assemblies to presentations to hosting sporting clubs and events, this hall will allow so many opportunities for our school from 2018 and onwards. I would like to thank members of the P&C along with our state member Mr Chris Whiting and Education Minister Kate Jones for their endorsement of this project for our school. This has been a long time coming for our staff, students and parents and I can not wait for our first school assembly in the Hall.

As the new Deputy Principal of Year 5 & 6, I would like to say hello and thank you for welcoming my son Logan who has just started in Prep and I into your school community. Having been in this role only a very short time, I already feel like part of the Bounty team and I think that this has really come down to how welcoming the whole school community has been. As only natural, I have had a busy start to the term familiarising myself with many aspects of school life here at Bounty. The friendly faces, the supportive staff and the engaging learning environments have been real standouts in this process and I feel extremely privileged to be able to call Bounty Boulevard State School my new home.



I am very much looking forward to gradually over time meeting the school community and further learning about and contributing to all the wonderful things Bounty has to offer.

Hints for engaging in Book-a-Night

Book-a-Night is a brilliant opportunity for you to work alongside us, as partners in your child's education. Not to mention enjoying some quiet time together away from the lights and noise of technology. I have included some handy hints for how you can make the most of this time and best support your child in their reading.

#### Before Reading -

- Turn off televisions, technology and move away from distractions
- Make sure that you are both comfortable and can clearly see the text
- Discuss the cover and the title
- Flick through the pictures
- Predict what the book might be about

#### During Reading -

- Discuss the events that are occurring in the book
- Predict what might happen next
- Talk about how what is happening is similar or different to events that your child has experienced
- Vary how you read with your child (e.g. take turns, reading different characters' dialogue, etc)**

#### After Reading -

- ✦ Talk about the characters, story events or important information
- ✦ Have your child retell the story or text to another family member
- ✦ Discuss preferences and provide explanations
- ✦ **Ask questions to clarify your child's understanding of the book**

### Life Education - This letter was distributed to all students on Thursday 20th April.

In term 2 (starting end of week 4 – week 8), Life Education will be visiting Bounty Boulevard State School. All year levels will have the opportunity to take part in this program. Later in the year there will be an additional opportunity for Year 5 and Year 6 students to take part in the **'Talk About It'** program. This program will be facilitated by specialist sexual health educators working in partnership with the classroom teacher. Notes will go home to the Year 5 and Year 6 students regarding this in term 3.

Life Education is a not for profit, charity organisation. Due to some significant funding that Life Education has secured through Queensland Health they are in a position to provide the program to you at a minimal cost of just \$9.00 per student. This is a saving of over \$8.50 per student. The \$9.00 is for one session 1 – 1.5 hrs depending on the year level of the students.

Life Education has been supporting Queensland schools and classroom teachers to deliver health education for more than 30 years. The program is updated and aligned to both the existing Queensland curriculum and the draft ACARA Health and Physical Education curriculum. They work with schools, teachers, parents and students to deliver programs which provide a stimulating, interactive learning environment that creates a memorable experience for children.
