

Recruitment & Selection

I have recently been involved in a regional recruitment process. I have recruited an Occupational Therapist to support our students particularly those in the junior school Prep-2. The successful applicant is Mrs Lisa Foster who will commence in our school at the beginning of Term 2. Lisa has just completed the regional induction and will assist in a variety of areas to promote literacy and assisting children with a number of facets which may be blocking their learning. The OT will be employed from the federal government Investing for Schools (I4S) funding. She will provide support for students and build teacher and teacher aide knowledge. The OT will also conduct parent workshops in Term 2/3. This will be a welcome addition to our staff. We will collect some bench mark data and evaluate student progress in December 2016. We are hoping to continue this endeavour for 2 years after the review period.

The staff within Year 2 and 3 have also been busy assessing the students through a variety of assessment tools to be able to inform their planning for the remainder of the year. Term 1 is busy across the school while this assessment is being carried out as it then provides the teachers with information they require about their students and allows them to cater for the different learning needs within their classroom. Teachers differentiate their learning programs for the children so that all children are able to work and be challenged at their level. I would like to acknowledge the hard working staff in Year 2 and 3. Their professionalism and dedication towards your children is inspirational. They have put in some long and hard hours at the start of this year and I would like to publicly acknowledge their efforts.



# Term 1 Week 6 Hands-Up Survey Results

## How Bounty Boulevard SS is travelling to school?

During week 6 of term we conducted in class hands-up surveys to find out how families are travelling to school. The survey results are below.



We have had an 14% increase in active travel since the baseline survey was conducted in week 2. On the last day of our survey week it was National Ride2School Day. As can be seen from the graph below we had great success with this day and had over 397 students walk and wheel (students on bicycle, scooters and skateboards).

If we can achieve these results on an event day, surely as a school community we would do better on an average school day. With almost 50% of the school population living in the catchment area it should be easy for most families to try and walk or wheel at least once a week. Why not pick up one of our Active and Safe Mapping Booklets from the office and use the suggested parking locations and walk or wheel part of the way to and from school.
