Communication Across the School

Semester 1 Parent-Teacher interviews can now be booked online. Go to www.schoolinterviews.com.au and enter the code grzre . **This is a great opportunity to discuss your child's learning for the semester. These will be occurring in Week 10 and 11.**

Part of my role as a Deputy Principal is ensuring that we as a school keep parents informed about what's going on in our school community. According to our school opinion survey last year, 86.1% of our parent body (who were interviewed) agreed that as a school we *keep parents well informed*.

As a school, I think this is something we have targeted to ensure that we not only improve in this aspect, but also increase the provision of information to our parents and the community. Our school has two Facebook sites. The P&C Facebook site is a great site and provides parents with key updates and links to the North Lakes community. The school Facebook site informs parents about specific school events, initiatives or achievements.

The purchase of our school sign last year was a step in the right direction with quick messages flashing on the screen providing parents with reminders about events coming up along with updating them with information. QSchools (app for iOS and Android) links directly with the school website and is such a quick and easy reference guide for what is going on in our school. It also provides updates and alerts to inform parents about information along with the functionality of pushing out critical information. Our school Twitter account (@bountyblvdss) often has pictures and captions to update parents about teaching and learning occurring across the school.

The parent liaison network is a strong network of parent volunteers (one from each class) who will help in the dissemination of information across the school. Old fashioned ways of communication include letters coming out to parents and carers along with the Bounty Bulletin (newsletter) coming out on a fortnightly basis. Email and class newsletters are also effective means of communication. The school has just introduced an SMS system for the school (which can be used for more than just absences) and this has proved to be a positive initiative with great feedback from parents already.

As a school we are looking at utilising the televisions in the front office that will display a rolling PowerPoint of information. The office also has a whiteboard on financial updates and reminders on display.

In Term 3, I am pleased to announce that as a school we will be introducing QParents. More information about QParents can be found at this link: <https://qparents.qld.edu.au/#/login> . This is just another way that as a school, we are striving to ensure we keep you up to date with as much information as possible through many different mediums. 

Semester 1 Reporting

The students at Bounty Boulevard State School have enjoyed an action packed Semester One of Learning, Love and Laughter. Students have been dedicated to demonstrate their learning through a variety of experiences and assessments. The Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Framework outlines the requirements for each Queensland State School to deliver the curriculum for Prep to Year Six. In implementing the P-12 Curriculum, schools are required to assess, monitor and capture student achievement.

Each semester the school provides a summative report card for all students to their parents / carers. The Semester One report will be generated on Monday 13 June 2016. It is anticipated that these report cards will be in the inbox of parents by Tuesday 14 June 2016. Once we generate from our end, it is out of our control to determine the exact time when these will arrive in the inbox of parents and carers.

Book-a-Night is an expectation at Bounty Boulevard as part of homework. Students should be participating in daily reading at home and recording this in their home reading log. Book-a-night values three types of reading: being read to, being the reader with support from an adult, and independent reading. Levelled readers are available from the Learning Innovation Centre and borrowing of these is strongly encouraged. The levels are allocated to be easy for your child to read as reading at home should be an enjoyable opportunity for students to practice their reading with you. When we read, we read for meaning. Discuss what your child has read to ensure that they have a good understanding of the key events or information. **Bookmarks which have information about "Reading for Meaning" are available from the front counter of the LIC.** These bookmarks provide a range of questions that you can ask your child before, during and after reading. Book-a-night is celebrated and valued at Bounty Boulevard as students are acknowledged as they reach each milestone.

Intersection Upgrade - Bounty Boulevard, Aurora Boulevard & Fidler Street

Moreton Bay Regional Council is upgrading the intersection at Bounty Boulevard, Aurora Boulevard & Fidler Street, North Lakes. The project includes road widening and alteration of the existing median strip on the southern end of Bounty Boulevard, the installation of bicycle storage areas and new signal detection. The improvements will improve safety for motorists and pedestrians. Work is expected to commence mid to late May and take approximately 8 weeks to complete, weather permitting. The construction team will typically be on site during the hours of 7am, and 5pm weekdays. When works commence, Council asks that you observe the instructions of work crews and road signage, plan any travel accordingly, and apologies for an inconvenience that you may encounter.

There are lots of ways to help your child learn to read! It is never too early to start – from the time they are babies to when they are in high school, you can help your child with developing the skills and a love for reading.

Reading with Babies and Toddlers

Reading together requires your baby or toddler to sit long enough for a book! Here are some tips that may help -

- Try reading together just before bath time or right after dinner. This way your child may not be too tired to focus his attention on the book. If he is too tired to read, put the book away for another time – book times should be happy times!
- Fun, brightly coloured books with lots of big, bright pictures are the most engaging for babies and toddlers. Books with stiff cardboard pages are easier for little hands to hold.
- Books that are rhyming or can be sung let you enjoy clapping, singing and bouncing up and down together to the rhythm of the language.

The joy of reading at home with your child is that you can be as expressive as you like with no one else listening! Add hand gestures, body movements, whisper soft words and shout loud words.

Children will develop favourites – keep these books handy and reread over and over again. This is an enjoyable experience for your little one that also helps to develop good reading habits as well as a love for reading.
