### INCLUSION

#### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2021). Your child will be identified under this process if they have a disability recognised in the Disability Discrimination Act 1992.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical (medical- of or affecting the body), cognitive (differences in mental abilities- students learning differently to others), sensory (affects bodily or mental ability) or social/emotional (processes that affect emotions and behaviour)
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process.

The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. #### Personalised Learning Plans

Each and every day, in every classroom our students are provided quality differentiated teaching and learning experiences. Some students require higher levels of targeted teaching to address significant barriers the student may be experiencing when accessing and participating in the curriculum. These students have a **Personalised Learning Plan**. This is a plan that records the functional impact of their barriers and the adjustments required. It is also a place to track progress and collect evidence of growth. In Term 1 and Term 3 of each year we share these plans with parents/carers and seek feedback and endorsement. If your child has a Personalised Learning Plan and you are yet to endorse it this year, please be in contact with your child's classroom teacher or inclusion teacher. We value your input and continued support of this school-wide process.





## NATIONAL RECONCILIATION WEEK

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all Australians to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia.

The dates for NRW are the same each year; **27 May to 3 June**.

These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey — the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively.

**27 May 1967** On this day, Australia's most successful **referendum** saw more than 90 per cent of Australians vote to give the Australian Government power to make laws for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and recognise them in the Census.

**3 June 1992** On this day, the Australian High Court delivered the Mabo decision, the culmination of Eddie Koiki Mabo's challenge to the legal fiction of 'terra nullius' (land belonging to no one) and leading to the legal recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the Traditional Owners and Custodians of lands. This decision paved the way for Native Title.

Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all Australians as we move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Ms Gregory has set up an engaging Reconciliation Week display in the cultural room and will be sharing a story with all students to teach the message of reconciliation. The texts being shared this year are Respect, Aunty Fay Muir (Prep-Year 2) and Back on Country, Adam Goodes (Year 3 to Year 6).

Our two wonderful school choirs, The Bounty Voice and The Bounty Singers have joined together to sing a beautiful song called "Reconciliation Now" to celebrate National Reconciliation Week. This special song from Boonwurrung country, was written by Deborah Cheetham AO with the help of children from the 'Dandenong Short Black Opera for Kids' program who contributed great suggestions for the lyrics. This will be available to view on the school Facebook site on Monday morning. Ms Gregory would like to acknowledge how deeply touched and appreciative she is to these outstanding teachers for their Cultural awareness and sensitivity.
