Our focus has not changed and we still remain focussed on our Moral Purpose:



INCLUSION

During Term 2, the inclusion team in collaboration with classroom teachers will make decisions around which students should be counted in the NCCD (National Consistent Collection of Data). Students who receive ongoing adjustments at school (10+ weeks) to support them to access education, on the same basis all students, will be included in the data set.

On Wednesday 24 April a couple of Inclusion Teachers from BBSS presented de-identified student evidence sets for a first round of inter- school moderation, leading up to the final data submission date of 4 August.

INCLUSION

How does the NCCD assist schools?

The NCCD prompts schools to record the adjustments already undertaken in schools to support students.

- Reviewing learning and support systems: The NCCD allows schools to better understand the functional needs of their students with disability. It captures the work of schools in providing personalised learning and support for students with disability who require adjustments due to the functional impact of their disability.
- Providing greater understanding: The NCCD helps schools gain a greater understanding of their students with disability and identify areas of need for both students and staff.
- **Developing professional judgement:** The professional learning available to support the NCCD process helps build the professional judgement of school teams who are required to provide educational adjustments for students with disability without relying on a medical or clinical diagnosis alone.
- Recognising support and adjustments provided: The NCCD helps to formally and consistently recognise the support and adjustments provided to students with disability as defined in the DDA.

Every Day Counts is a state-wide initiative that aims to assist in improving student attendance at school through a shared commitment by students, parents, caregivers, schools and the community. Unexplained Absences

Each Monday we run SMS for those absences that have not yet been explained for the week prior. Please respond with the reason your child was absent on the date/s within the text and we will update their profile. It is important that all student absences have been explained by their parents/care givers. Thank you in advance for your assistance.

Reporting your student/s absences

A friendly reminder to please report any absences through one of the below methods. We understand families notify the class teacher however class teachers do not enter absences. By using one of these methods below, we can ensure your student's absence is captured prior to the daily unexplained text message.

- 1. Text 0429 398 844 with student name, class and reason for absence
- 2. **Call** the school on 3482 1333 and select option 1, at the prompt leave a message detailing student's name, class and reason for absence
- 3. Email student name, class and reason for absence
- 4. **QParents app** Select Notify absences and enter details

CITY OF MORETON BAY - PROACTIVE SCHOOL PARKING PROGRAM

The City of Moreton Bay regulates parking or stopping of vehicles on footpaths, bicycle paths, shared paths, dividing strips or nature strips. Please note that vehicles that are parked with two wheels on the footpath/nature strip and two wheels on the road is not considered as a lawful parking practice.

Council is legally obliged to enforce these regulations, and our Proactive School Safety Patrol Program contributes to this enforcement.


During Proactive School Safety Patrols, enforcement of unlawful parking is applied by obtaining photographic evidence and issuing a penalty infringement notice.

Council prefers that vehicle drivers are educated.
